## Extended Access Hubs

### Booking Guide

*To reduce clinical risk, all appointments booked must be accompanied by a clinical triage.*

NURSE'S appointments can be booked for the following at Hubs (15 mins)

HCA's appointments can be booked for the following at Hubs (15 mins)

GPs are expected to provide the usual scope of service except for the exclusions below: GP & Advanced Nurse Practitioner) Hub appointment EXCLUSION criteria

*(If patients require special assistance, please add to hub slots notes at point of booking)*



- Contraception Initiation
- Contraception follow up
- Sexual Health Checks
- Cervical Smears
- Wound Care - Burns, Scalds
- Bloods
- Asthma Review

- Sexual Health Screening
- Blood Tests
- CVD Review (30 min appt)
- Diabetes Part 1 (30 min appt)  
Metrix includes blood tests, foot check, BP, height and weight
- New Patient Health Checks (30 min appt)
- NHS Health Checks (30 min appt)
- Blood Pressure Checks

**Please DO NOT book HUB appointments with a GP or ANP for the following:**

- Patients with long term, chronic and enduring health problems
- Routine reviews for long terms conditions (these should be booked with a nurse)
- Palliative care patients with advance care planning needs
- Patients registered with Safe Haven service
- Patients with serious mental health issues or who require continuity of care
- Patients seeking pharmaceutical assistance for substance or alcohol misuse
- Conditions likely to require MRIs being ordered
- Minor Surgery
- Private Medicals & Home Visits
- Long term/chronic medical/fit certificates
- All non-core NHS letters (e.g. housing benefits)
- Any non-core NHS services (e.g. travel immunisation and medicals)
- Private and Routine non-urgent NHS referrals (*Recommended Referrals will be made to practice. Referral must be appropriately signed off by patients registered GP.*)

#### Referrals Made At A Hub

2WW referral - will be completed by hub GPs. Practices are expected to put in place appropriate safety netting to ensure patients receive an appointment once a discharge summary is received.
